Book a crossing on the MV Fundy Rose from Digby, Nova Scotia

The MV *Fundy Rose*, offers daily crossings between Digby, Nova Scotia and Saint John, New Brunswick. All types of vehicles including cars, RVs, trucks, tour buses, and motorcycles, are welcome aboard—as well as walk-on passengers and four-legged friends.

Reduced travel times, plus a host of fantastic amenities make your journey quick and comfortable. Breathe in fresh salt air from the outdoor seating and viewing area on this Digby Ferry, and keep a keen eye on the Bay of Fundy for whales and other magnificent marine life.

Hiking and Lunch with In Step Adventures Split Rock Hike

Just 10 minutes outside of Saint John, this incredible trail follows along the Lorneville Coast to the mouth of the Musquash Estuary. Rugged and beautiful, it was conceived and forged by Leah and Adam Wilkins of ExploreLorneville.ca in a vision to give people the opportunity to take in yet another piece of our incredible Bay of Fundy coast line. The trail has become extremely popular with the locals and trail running community, and a 'not to miss' for hikers coming to visit the area.

4.5 km of moderate difficulty, this trail winds along the bay, overlooking jagged coves and hidden rock beaches. Guides will spot you as you explore a 'split in the rock' cavern and take you down to one of the hidden beaches. Finishing at the Musquash Head Light House, you can opt to hike out at the Lighthouse Road or continue another 2.5 km on coastal trail to Black Beach.

Spend an Afternoon in Rockwood Park Rockwood Park

One of Canada's largest municipal parks, **Rockwood Park** offers a campground, an Interpretation Centre, lakes for swimming, an 18-hole golf course and a playground. With more than 50km of hiking trails to explore, the park is a four-season adventure zone with something for everyone. In the summer enjoy rock climbing, kayaking, hydro bikes, biking and more. Visit in the autumn and enjoy the spectacular colours of the Fall foliage. Explore the park in winter, and enjoy sleigh rides, cross country skiing and skating.

Enjoy the Afternoon at The Kingston Spa at La Belle Cabane

Start in your private pod with the dry or steam sauna, soak in the cold cedar plunge or hot tub, rest on the heated stone bed or by the fire (repeat or rest) and complete your stay by spending time (approximately 30 minutes) in the shared salt room - an infrared sauna with halotherapy.

Halotherapy is known to be a natural, non-invasive treatment that involves inhaling medical grade microscopic salt particles (MSP) that are emitted in the air by a halogenerator. It is a practice that has been known to be used to treat respiratory and skin conditions, and known to provide other holistic health benefits for relaxation, stress, immunity, sleep and more.
